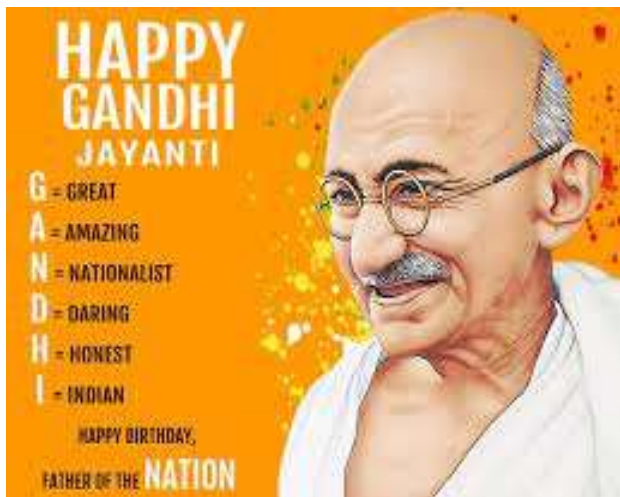


## **GANDHI JAYANTI CELEBRATION 2021 - JUNIOR COLLEGE (Arts Department)**
